Welcome to the first Signs of Safety newsletter, bringing you up-to-date on the latest Signs of Safety activity in Knowsley.

Knowsley has teamed up with St Helens to implement Signs of Safety as a framework for working with families - not just in Children's Social Care, but across Early Help and partner agencies.

St Helens has their own project lead and plan for implementation, however, training sessions will involve staff from both Knowsley and St Helens.



Implementation plan

Our implementation plan is currently being developed and this will be shared at the next Knowsley Safeguarding Children's Board meeting on Friday, 23 November 2018.

The implementation plan will incorporate timescales for training for staff and partners, the alignment of ICS templates as well as other relevant updates.

Signs of Safety champions

In other local authorities that have implemented Signs of Safety, feedback from staff indicated that they needed support with Signs of Safety practice. Learning from others, we are looking for Signs of Safety champions to support staff implementing the model in practice. Champions will receive additional training.

Training

ICS

To support the implementation of Signs of Safety, the forms / templates on ICS will become more aligned with Signs of Safety over the next 12 months. To achieve this, the assistance of practitioners will be called upon in implementing the changes through a working group.
